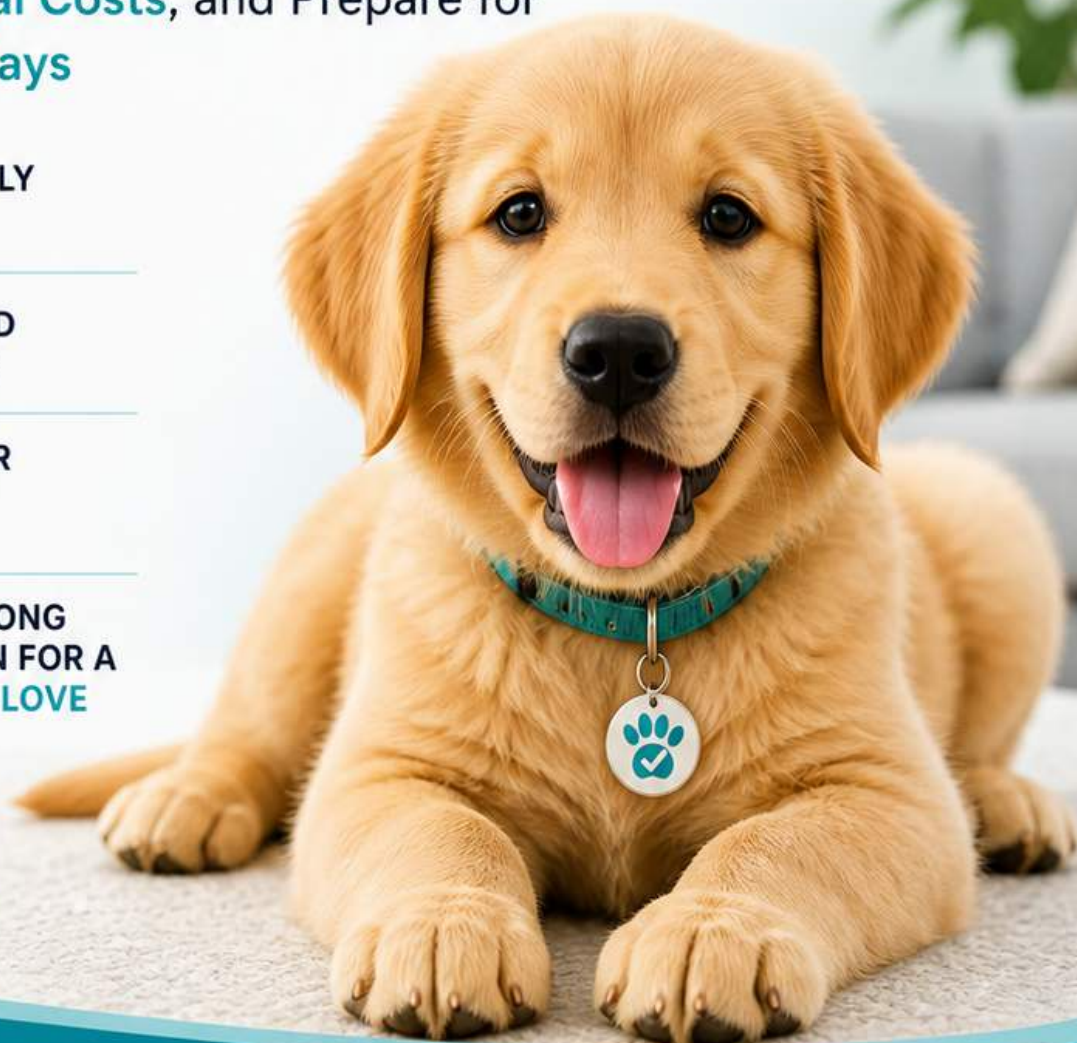

1. INTRODUCTION: BEFORE YOU BRING A DOG HOME

Getting a dog is one of the most rewarding decisions you can make—but it's also one of the most misunderstood.

Most first-time owners:

- Choose based on looks
- Underestimate time and cost
- Fail to prepare properly

2. THE BIGGEST MISTAKE FIRST-TIME OWNERS MAKE

Choosing a dog based on appearance instead of lifestyle compatibility.

A high-energy dog in a low-energy home leads to:

- Destructive behavior
- Anxiety (for both dog and owner)
- Rehoming

👉 Example:

- A Border Collie looks amazing—but needs HOURS of daily activity
- A French Bulldog fits better for apartment living

Rule:

👉 Your lifestyle should choose the dog—not your emotions



3. CHOOSING THE RIGHT DOG FOR YOUR LIFESTYLE

Ask yourself:

1. How active are you?

- Low → small, calm breeds
- Medium → adaptable dogs
- High → working breeds

2. How much time do you have daily?

<1 hour → reconsider ownership or choose low-maintenance breeds

3. Living situation

- Apartment vs house
- Yard vs no yard

4. Experience level

First-time → avoid high-drive or stubborn breeds

👉 Pro Tip:

Use a structured selection system (like PickFido) instead of guessing.

4. THE TRUE COST OF OWNING A DOG

Initial Costs:

- Adoption/Purchase: \$50 – \$3,000+
- Supplies: \$200 – \$500
- Vet setup: \$100 – \$300

Monthly Costs:

- Food: \$40 – \$150
- Vet (avg): \$20 – \$100
- Grooming: \$0 – \$100
- Misc (toys, treats): \$20 – \$75

👉 **Realistic monthly total: \$100 – \$300+**

Unexpected Costs:

- Emergency vet bills: \$500 – \$5,000
- Training: \$100 – \$1,000



5. PREPARING YOUR HOME (BEFORE DAY ONE)

Dog-proof your home like you would for a toddler.

Remove or secure:

- Electrical cords
- Toxic foods (chocolate, grapes)
- Shoes, furniture edges

Create:

- A sleeping area
- Feeding station
- Safe space (crate or bed)



6. ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES CHECKLIST

- ✓ Food & water bowls
- ✓ High-quality dog food
- ✓ Crate
- ✓ Bed
- ✓ Leash & collar
- ✓ ID tags
- ✓ Toys (chew + mental stimulation)
- ✓ Cleaning supplies

👉 Don't overbuy—start simple.



7. THE FIRST 24 HOURS: WHAT TO EXPECT

Your dog will likely:

- Be nervous
- Not eat much
- Explore cautiously

Your job:

- Stay calm
- Keep environment quiet
- Avoid overwhelming them

👉 No visitors. No chaos.



8. THE FIRST 7 DAYS: SETTING THE FOUNDATION

Focus on:

- Routine (feeding, walking)
- Name recognition
- Potty training

Golden Rule:

Consistency > Perfection



9. THE FIRST 30 DAYS: BUILDING HABITS THAT LAST

By Day 30, your dog should:

- ✓ Know basic commands
- ✓ Understand routine
- ✓ Be partially house-trained

Daily structure example:

- Morning walk
- Feeding
- Midday stimulation
- Evening walk
- Wind-down



10. TRAINING BASICS EVERY OWNER MUST KNOW

Start with:

- Sit
- Stay
- Come
- Leave it

Training principles:

- Short sessions (5–10 mins)
- Reward-based
- Consistency

👉 Never rely on punishment—it creates fear, not obedience.

11. COMMON PROBLEMS (AND QUICK FIXES)

Problem: Chewing everything

- ✓ Solution: Provide better alternatives

Problem: Barking

- ✓ Identify trigger (boredom, fear)

Problem: Potty accidents

- ✓ Increase frequency of outdoor breaks

12. HEALTH, VET VISITS & PREVENTATIVE CARE

Schedule within first week:

- Initial vet check
- Vaccinations
- Parasite prevention

Ongoing:

- Annual checkups
- Dental care
- Weight monitoring



13. TIME COMMITMENT: THE TRUTH

Dogs need:

- Daily interaction
- Exercise
- Mental stimulation

👉 Minimum: 1–2 hours/day of active attention

If you can't provide this → reconsider ownership.



14. WHEN THINGS GO WRONG

It will happen.

Common struggles:

- Behavioral issues
- Stress
- Regret

Solution:

- Adjust routine
- Seek training help
- Stay consistent

👉 Most problems are fixable with structure.

15. FINAL CHECKLIST + NEXT STEPS

Before getting a dog:

- ✓ I understand the costs
- ✓ I have time daily
- ✓ My home is prepared
- ✓ I chose a breed based on lifestyle
- ✓ I have a 30-day plan
